Upon Horse Arrival

_____ The horse will be quarantined for a minimum of 7 days. The VP will determine any additional days. The VP will facilitate the introduction to a herd after quarantine.

_____ Member is responsible for turning out and feeding their horse every weekend.

_____ Member is responsible for turning in their horse every day of the week. Never leave a horse out alone.

General Information

_____ All communication about horses' needs are to be written on the white board at the barn

_____ It is a co-op barn, everyone pitches in and helps each other. Everyone is a volunteer and no one works for one another.

_____ Full board includes _____ bags of shavings, barn help, hay; Lower Pasture Board does not include shavings or hay, any night spent at the barn is charged per night

_____ Stalls are \$ _____ per stall to be cleaned if you wish to have that service - write horse's name on the white board (available only on weekdays).

_____ VP makes all decisions on horse movements, and movement of horse into a herd needs to be discussed with VP and affected club members

_____ Member needs to provide an AM container for feeding program daily

_____ Board is due no later than the 14th of the month or will incur late charges

_____ Stall cleaning payments to hired help are due by the Monday following each week of work

_____ The TVRC board does its best to create suitable herds based on age, behavior, and sex. Individual owners are not responsible for any possible injuries that may occur due to herd behavior and the turn out facilities.

_____ No horse is to ever be left alone outside. A horse can be alone in a paddock as long as horses are adjacent to him or her. No horse can ever be left alone in the Upper Pasture or Lower Pasture.

_____ No smoking.

_____ No one should ever be on a horse while inside the barn. Horses should always be led through the barn with a halter and lead rope, not allowed to negotiate the aisle on their own.

_____ Stalls are to be cleaned daily.

_____ Bedding bags should be thrown in the dumpster. Wheelbarrows are to be left empty at the rear of the barn. If necessary, re-distribute the refuse in the dumpster or move the ramp to be able to empty the wheelbarrows. Do not leave an empty wheelbarrow on the ramp.

_____ No one is permitted in the loft area except the attendant or club officers.

_____ Aisles are to be swept after grooming your horse.

_____ Tack room doors are to be kept locked when not in use. This also includes while you are out riding.

_____ All horses must be ridden with bridles.

_____ Do not leave a tacked up horse in a stall.

_____ Stall gates should be kept closed at all times.

_____ Horses should not be left unattended in the crossties.

_____ Lights are to be turned off when leaving the barn.

_____ Riders are to remain on the roads or authorized trails only, provided that this is not to be construed as a limitation under the provisions of the deed restrictions applicable to property owners of the Trout Valley Association. Do not ride on trails that cross residents' lawns when the ground is soft and damage to the lawn may occur. Please also be careful of the common grounds when they are susceptible to damage by the horses' hooves.

_____ When jumping, a rider must be accompanied by a second responsible individual and wear protective headgear. Anyone under the age of 18 must wear a helmet at all times on a horse, no exceptions.

_____ The chains at the front and back of the barn should be kept up when leaving the barn and whenever opening the paddock gates.
